

A California Retrospect by Dan C. Mulock

As told to his daughter, Sarah Duncan

Twin Palms - San Gabriel



My father married Anna Stuart in 1902. A son, Robert, was born on New Years Eve, 1906. They built the house at 549 Twin Palms Drive about 1905 at a cost of approximately \$3,500.00. Before that they lived in a house east of Bedford Road, in San Marino. The new house included a large bed-sitting room, with an outside entrance, for my father's mother but she refused to leave the adobe. Robert died in 1915 and Anna in 1916. In 1918, my father married my mother and I was born in 1919.

They sold the house on Twin Palms in 1946 and built on one of the two remaining lots. The one remaining palm tree (the other was thought to be dying and was removed in the late 50s) and the mulberry descendant are on that lot. I live on the other lot, in a California style home built in 1955, with the old olive tree in my backyard and a mission fig from my grandmother's fruit garden. My parent's built their home around a Southern Magnolia, that was planted in 1878, when my father's father died.

The San Gabriel Mission and the Jonathan Heritage Foundation are hosting the "San Gabriel Mission's History Forum!" on Saturday, April 16, 2011, 10 a.m. to 1 p.m., at the Mission, 427 S. Junipero Serra Dr. (at Mission Road), San Gabriel, CA 91776.

Program:

Dr. Jennifer Perry - Associate Professor of Anthropology, Pomona College ~ "Peoples of the California Channel Islands"

Noted anthropologist Dr. Perry will present an overview of the prehistory of the Channel Islands from archaeological and ethnohistoric perspectives. She will discuss why this region is so unique with respect to the antiquity and complexity of its Tongva and Chumash heritage.

Dr. James A. Sandos - Farquhar Professor of the Southwest, University of Redlands

Patricia Sandos, Independent Scholar - "Chisli, Canuch, and Junipero Serra: Indian Response to Mission San Diego, 1769-1788"


